PRESENTATION OF THE CONFERENCE

The extraordinary acceleration now underway of Artificial Intelligence appears, alarmingly, to be increasingly geared toward enhancing military capabilities rather than benefiting humanity in achieving the SDGs, building peace, and promoting social justice. There is a great risk of repeating the history of the aftermath of the Industrial Revolution when concentration on military applications of technological advancement led to two devastating world wars. At this moment in history, the ability of the United Nations to fulfill its mission of preventing their recurrence in the future also depends on enhancing the Organization's capacity to harness the commitment of all actors – governments, civil society, the private sector – to orient Al and its many current and potential applications towards achieving this basic aim. The Pact for the Future, adopted by the General Assembly on September 22, 2024 (A/Res/70/1), and the Global Digital Compact, approved as an integral component of the Pact, testify to a renewed commitment by the international community to move decisively in this direction and to act to leverage digital innovations toward the fulfillment of the SDGs. The Infopoverty World Conference is committed to making a distinct contribution to this crucial effort.

Launched in 2001 at the dawn of the digital era, the Conference has sought to showcase the key contribution that new digital technologies could make to the implementation of the MDGs first and SDGs now. Drawing on the contribution of over 1000 eminent thought leaders and practitioners, over the years the Conference has served to bring to light and support the actual delivery of concrete, effective solutions addressing the key factors that underly poverty and cause its persistence. A consistent focus in this perspective has been on ICT applications that serve to expand access to essential services such as healthcare and food security. Among the Conference's early accomplishments was the realization of the "ewelfare4all" Project that was endorsed at the 2005 WSIS and served to launch the ICT Village model. First realized in Borj Touil (Tunisia), the model was replicated and optimized in Sambaina (Madagascar), proclaimed "UN Millenium Village" in 2007. The forthcoming 24th edition of the Conference will focus the unique contribution that AI can make to streamlining and accelerating project implementation processes and maximizing their costeffectiveness, and to spreading their benefits and optimizing their governance. At this stage, the Conference aims to be an integral part of the important effort underway to engage governments, major corporations, and public and private institutions in a renewed effort to advance the UN vision for development and its Sustainable Development Goals, and to orient in that crucial sense the further development of AI, guided by the principles and actions embodied in the Global Digital Compact.

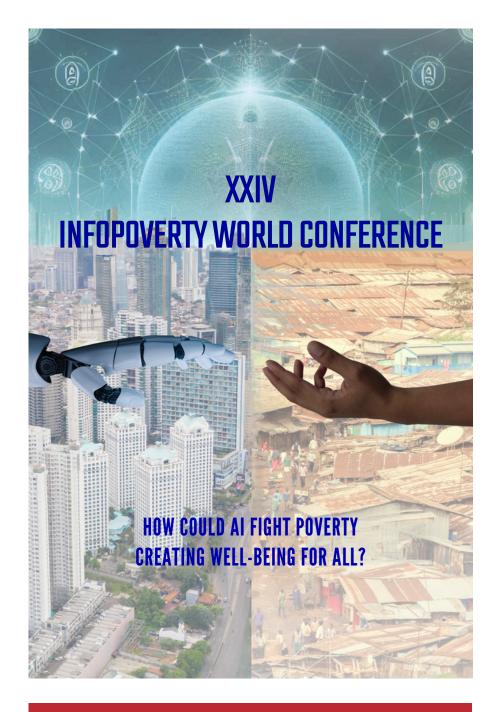
